




As a Co-op, all elementary through Jr. High parents must sign up to volunteer in an area of service at the time of registration.

Families with Jr/Sr high students enrolled in Jr/Sr. High classes receive a \$20/class discount on their K-6th gr. sibling classes. Families enrolling elementary students in Jr. High classes pay the Jr. High class fee (plus books/supplies), (the sibling discount does not apply). Families enrolling Jr. High students in 5/6 gr. classes pay the \$70 class fee, (plus books/supplies)

Class Descriptions

K-2nd grades

Musicology – Jennifer Kelaher – Pluck and scrape, puff and blow! Get set...GO! Do you know how many stringed and wind instruments you can make with things around the house? We can think of 20! No matter how many we actually make this semester, your children will have fun playing the instruments they create!

Romans, Gladiators & Coliseums – Renee Hinkston - This will be a fun, hands on craft oriented history class. We will be covering everything from the founding of Rome to the coming of the Barbarians, as well as taking an in depth look at Roman life, through crafts and fun hands on projects. *this is a Tapestry of Grace class, the curriculum use fee is \$7.00

Kreative Kids – Lillian Valentin – Students will explore different art mediums as they create their own crafts and art masterpieces!

Mathology –Sarah Hualde – this will be a fun, hands on, basic math class. Students will learn addition and subtraction by using manipulatives, games and worksheets.

Supervised free play – There is no charge for this play time, Rochelle Giordano will oversee this play time, however, parents must volunteer to help.

3rd – 6th grades

Land Animals of the 6th day – Heidi Creasman - What separates people from apes? How can a Great Dane be related to a Chihuahua? These are just a few of the questions that will be answered during this course! Students will have homework as well as hands on projects and in class experiments!

Writing Tales – Rochelle Giordano – This is a 3/4th grade level class. Writing Tales uses the classical approach of re-writing good stories. With the addition of your own creative touches, Writing Tales becomes a tool to make your own book of 15 stories. This is also a full grammar curriculum. Recommended for 4th graders, possibly 3rd graders who are able to write on their own already.

I.E.W. Writing (Instruction for early writing) – **Patti Elliott** – Introduction to writing techniques used in the Institute for Excellence in Writing program. This class prepares your student for our Lit & Comp A class!

Dangerous Days for Boys & Girls –Andrea Kavarian & Michelle Correia–this class is designed around the book by “Conn and Hal Iggulden.” Students will enjoy stories, crafts, knot tying relays, and making the perfect paper airplane, just to name a few!

Questions on Faith – Heidi Creasman - This is the final class in the Answers in Genesis series, we will be answering questions like; where did we come from and why are we different? What about dinosaurs and the ice age? What about aliens? This is a standalone class, prior enrollment is not necessary.

The Rise & Fall of Rome – Renee Hinkston - This history class will cover the founding of Rome to the Fall of the Empire and the invasion of the Barbarians, we will be reading one historical novel and alternating between class discussions, timeline history and hands on craft projects. **This is a Tapestry of Grace class, the curriculum use fee is \$7.00

Drama – Cindy Houghton – Timid students will gain confidence and natural actors will develop their talents as they write and act in their own play!

Sketching & Drawing – Cindy Houghton – This is a hands on sketching and drawing class! Students will learn to draw by actually drawing, not by reading about theories. Students will learn easy and useful tips for blending, shading, perspective and other techniques that will help them create realistic drawings.

Jr. High – 7th – 8/9th grades

Lit & Comp A-1 – Elvia Campos – Using Excellence in Writing and Literature books, students will develop quality writing skills as they write a variety of compositions. This is a 2 year cycle class – should be taken for 2 years before moving into Lit & Comp B. [This class starts at 8:30am](#)

General Science w/human physiology – Victoria Bachelier – This 7/8th grade course is designed to be a student’s first systematic introduction to the sciences. The course covers such topics as the scientific method, designing experiments, simple machines, archaeology, and biology, with a strong emphasis on human anatomy and physiology. There will be laboratory investigations.

Pre-Algebra – Sharla Godfrey – This is a year long course that covers all the necessary concepts to help your student make a smooth transition into Algebra I.

Earth Science – Serena Sanders – This 8/9th grade class will guide students in an examination of God's handiwork, including the sun, moon stars, planets, asteroids, comets, and meteors. This course studies the earth, including the atmosphere, the lithosphere, and the hydrosphere, with laboratory investigations.

Greek Mythology – Jennifer Dimsey – This will be a project based study of Greek Mythology that will improve your students understanding of great classical literature.

World History – Betsy Aeschliman - Are you ready to travel the world and learn about past civilizations? Come explore how people thought, worked and lived. You will be amazed at how God's hand is seen throughout history!

Multi-Age Electives, 7th – 12th grades

Sketching & Drawing – Cindy Houghton – This is a hands on sketching and drawing class! Students will learn to draw by actually drawing, not by reading about theories. Students will learn easy and useful tips for blending, shading, perspective and other techniques that will help them create realistic drawings.

Beginning Guitar – Susi Rowley – Students will learn guitar basics, different strums, and worship songs, as they begin their journey to worshipping God through guitar! **acoustic guitar & electric guitar tuner required.*

Home Economics – Cindy Houghton – Students will be equipped with practical skills they'll use every day of their lives! This God-centered class provides a working foundation for responsibilities throughout the entire home. Topics include grocery shopping, entertaining, first aid, babysitting, child care, personal hygiene, sewing, cleaning, laundry, making a budget, and more.

Foundations in Personal Finance – Victoria Bachelier – this 9th – 12th grade class will be using David Ramsey's "Foundations in Personal Finance" curriculum to help students become confident in their plan for their financial future!

Theatre – Trish Evans - Students will learn the fundamentals of acting & putting on a production. First semester concentrates on acting and theatre fundamentals. Second semester will include stagecraft, singing, dancing, producing, and performing in a full musical play ****Class occasionally ends at 3:30 during first semester, prior to performance; second semester class will end at 3:30 weekly, and requires additional practice and set construction days outside of ICAP.**

Sr. High, 9th – 12th grades

Biology – Karen Petersen – This 10th -12th lab course provides a detailed introduction to the methods and concepts of general biology. Emphasizing scientific method, classification, biochemistry, cellular biology, and will involve dissections as well as participation in the Science Fair. **This class starts at 8:30am**

Lit & Comp A-2 – Kacy Tribble – This is a faster pace class that will use Excellence in Writing and Literature books, students will develop quality writing skills as they write a variety of compositions. This is a 2 year cycle class – should be taken for 2 years before moving onto Lit & Comp B. **This class starts at 8:30am**

Chemistry – teacher tba - This 11/12th grade course will cover significant figures, units, classification, mole concept, stoichiometry, thermodynamics, kinetics, acids and bases, and many other topics in this lab based, college prep class. **This class starts at 8:30am** (Chemistry pre-req. - Students must have completed Algebra 1 and 2, or be currently enrolled in an Algebra 2 class.)*

Geometry – teacher tba – Students will expand on deductive reasoning, logic properties and theorems, geometric figures, tangents and proofs.

Lit & Comp B – Sally Hall – Using Excellence in Writing, Jensen's format writing and Literature books, students will continue to develop writing skills as they write a variety of compositions. **Prerequisite: 2 yrs of Lit & Comp. "A" or teacher approval.*

World Views – Gary Evans - This course endeavors to show students the difference between a Biblical World View and the prevailing and competing world views of today. Students will learn how the world "slants" views and continually influences the world's mind sets through advertising, news, and other media.

Algebra 1 – Dianne Householder – A comprehensive course that encourages students to use reasoning skills as they work with axioms, rules and principles of Algebra.

Debate – Karen Petersen – Students will learn to use their critical thinking skills as they search for truth using historical interpretations for debate.

World History – Betsy Aeschliman - Come join us as we explore past civilizations with an emphasis on the cultural icons in each one. You will become a world traveler and learn much in this interactive course. Throughout this course you will see how God's hand directed it all!!!

Physics – Jeannie Skrocki – this 11/12th grade class is a college prep physics course. It is advised that students have successfully completed Algebra 1, Algebra 2, and be currently enrolled in Geometry. Students will need to know and understand the definitions of sine, cosine, and tangent prior to taking this class. The course covers units, measurement, one-dimensional and two-dimensional motion, Newton's laws and their application, gravity, electrostatics and much more.
