(Mandatory; one parent from each NEW family must attend.)

As a Co-op, all elementary through Jr. High parents must sign up to volunteer in an area of service at the time of registration. Sr. high parents must sign up to help in one of their students' classrooms ONCE per quarter, or if you work we have areas you may help in at home. **A list of volunteer areas will be available during registration!** Families enrolling students in Jr/Sr High or Multi-Age classes receive a **\$20/class discount** on the K-6th gr. sibling classes. Families enrolling Elem. students in Jr. High classes pay the Jr. High class fee (plus supplies/books). Families enrolling Jr. High students in 5/6 grade classes pay the class fee of \$70, (plus supplies/books).

Class Descriptions

K-2nd grades

Heroes of the Bible: Erika Tutwiler – Your children will enjoy learning about Biblical Heroes through crafts, stories and dress-up fun!

Kreative Kids: Lillian Valentin – Students will explore different art mediums as they create their own masterpieces!

Dangerous days for boys & girls: Shelly Moore – this class is designed around the book by “Conn and Hal Iggulden.” Students will enjoy stories, crafts, knot tying relays, and making the perfect paper airplane, just to name a few!

La clase diverti da (Spanish Fun!): Claudia Garduno – Students will enjoy a fun introduction to Spanish through games, songs & activities!

Supervised free play: K-2nd grade students will enjoy supervised play time on the playground with friends!

3rd-6th grades

The Iditarod & Aviation 4 kids - 4/6th grades- Andrea Kavianian – Students will discover desolate Alaskan tundra as they learn about the “race extraordinaire,” the Alaskan Iditarod, then they will spend the second quarter learning about the world of Aviation!

Creative Writing, 3/4th grades – Michelle Correia – Your students discover the hidden writer hidden inside them as they learn to write for pleasure!

Geography through Literature – Rochelle Giordano – Your students will learn geography by working on maps in class and listening to great stories like “Seabird” and “Paddle to the Sea.” (homework will be optional!)

Beginning Guitar – Susi Rowley - Students will learn guitar basics as they embark on their journey to worshipping God through guitar!

Cooking Science – Andrea Kavianian: The kitchen is a great place to study science, and is a great place to have fun with food!

California History – Renee Hinkston – This continuing class will give each student a solid understanding of the development of our “Golden California” with a hands on approach. We will enjoy crafts, maps, eating and festivals! This class will have at least 2 fieldtrip as well as some homework.

The Seven C's of History – Heidi Creasman – (creation, corruption, catastrophe, confusion, Christ, Cross & consummation) Teaching our Children to defend their faith as we see God's plan in History!

IEW Writing – 5/6th grades (Instruction 4 Early Writing) – Patti Elliott - Introduction to writing techniques used in the Institute for Excellence in Writing program. This class prepares your student for our Lit & Comp A class!

Drama – Cindy Houghton - Timid students will gain confidence and natural actors will develop their talents as they write and act in their own play!

Exploring North America – Kari Fobar: Students will explore history, bringing history to life as they make interactive projects and learn about early American explorers. Students will create a book of pocket pages starting with moving west and finishing with building railroads. We will be studying history from 1775-1890, finding out about important facts of how our country was formed.

Meet the Great Art Masters 3 – Cindy Houghton - This hands on art class will explore the styles and techniques of the world's greatest artists. Students will learn about the artist and create works of art using the same techniques they learned from the great art masters. The most important aspect of the art projects are discovery, exploration, and individual creativity. This is a continuing class, new students are welcome.

Spanish Fun – Trish Welham: Students will be introduced to the Spanish language through games, songs and hands on activities!

Jr. High, 7th – 9th grades

Lit & Comp A1 – Elvia Campos - Using Excellence in Writing and Literature books, students will develop quality writing skills as they write a variety of compositions. This is a 2 year cycle class – should be taken for 2 years before moving into Lit & Comp B. [This class starts at 8:30am](#)

Hands on Science, 5th-8th grades - Victoria Bachelier – Explore the amazing world of science through exciting hands on experiments and projects!

Life Science, 7/8th grades – Serena Sanders - Examine God's handiwork by studying cells, genetics, the different kingdoms and more, with in-class instruction and labs. This class will involve dissections as well as participating in the Science Fair.

Pre-Algebra – Angela Mooney – This is a year long course that covers all the necessary subjects to help your student make a smooth transition into Algebra I.

American History – Betsy Aeschliman – Discover God's faithful plan in the foundation of our country through today.

Multi-Age Electives, 7th – 12th grades

Oil Painting – Cindy Houghton – This is an intro level oil painting class where students will learn basic techniques that they will turn into beautiful paintings! **This class starts at 8:30am**

Economics – Steve Hall – Students will cover supply and demand, economic systems, and national economic issues – a real world experience during these trying times!

Beginning Guitar – Susi Rowley - Students will learn guitar basics, different strums, and worship songs, as they begin their journey to worshipping God through guitar! New and continuing students are welcome. **acoustic guitar & electric guitar tuner required.*

Creative Cooking 2– Victoria Bachelier & Cindy Houghton – Continuing our cooking class, students will learn to prepare 30 minute meals along with other helpful hints for the kitchen and home.

Sr. High, 9th – 12th grades

Biology – Karen Petersen - This lab course provides a detailed introduction to the methods and concepts of general biology. Emphasizing scientific method, classification, biochemistry, cellular biology, and will involve dissections as well as participation in the Science Fair. **This class starts at 8:30am**

Sr. High Lit & Comp A2 – Kacy Tribble – This is a faster pace class that will use Excellence in Writing and Literature books, students will develop quality writing skills as they write a variety of compositions. This is a 2 year cycle class – should be taken for 2 years before moving onto Lit & Comp B. **This class starts at 8:30am**

Algebra 2 – Angela Mooney - A comprehensive course that encourages students to use reasoning skills as they work with axioms, rules and principles of Algebra.

Lit & Comp B – Sally Hall - Using Excellence in Writing, Jensen's format writing and Literature books, students will continue to develop writing skills as they write a variety of compositions. **Prerequisite: 2 yrs of Lit & Comp. "A" or teacher approval.**This class will extend into lunch, will end at 12:25pm***

Spanish 1 – Lauren Russell - Students will quickly learn to speak, read, write and translate sentences as they memorize common vocabulary words through fun and challenging games and assignments
