As a Co-op, all elementary through Jr. High parents must sign up to volunteer in an area of service at the time of registration. Families with students enrolled in the Jr/Sr. High Academy program receive a \$20/class discount on their K-6<sup>th</sup> gr. sibling classes. Families enrolling elementary students in Jr. High classes pay the Jr. High class fee (plus books/supplies), (the sibling discount does not apply). Families enrolling Jr. High students in 5/6 gr. classes pay the \$75 class fee, (plus books/supplies)

## Class Descriptions

### K-2nd grades

**K-1<sup>st</sup> gr. Kindergarten – Renee Hinkston** – The 9am-10am Kindergarten class is a stand-alone class. Students will develop their phonic and math skills through fun monthly themes and hands on activities.

**K-2<sup>nd</sup> gr. Early Learners (2 hour block class) – Renee Hinkston** - Join us for an exciting class for students ready to learn! Students will be learning through Literature and hands on Science with crafts and other fun activities! We use a literature/seasonal based curriculum that is a hands on exploration of God's awesome creation!

**K-3<sup>rd</sup> gr. Fearfully and wonderfully made – Sarah Hualde** - A crafty way to celebrate the incredible creation of our bodies. No reading or writing skills are needed for this class. Just lots of glue, crayons, a good pair of safety scissors, and a smile!

**K-3<sup>rd</sup> gr. Fun and Games - Lisa Drorbaugh** – Students will learn teamwork and good sportsmanship as they play good old fashioned games, Kickball, jacks, and Chinese jumprope just to name a few!

### 3<sup>rd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> grades

**Sports Fundamentals – Julie Crouch** – Students will learn teamwork and good sportsmanship as they learn the rules and develop skills as they learn and play a new game each month!

**Writing Tales 2 – Rochelle Giordano** – This is a 4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> grade level class. Writing Tales uses the classical approach of re-writing good stories. With the addition of your own creative touches, Writing Tales becomes a tool to make your own book of 15 stories. This is also a full grammar curriculum. Recommended for 4th graders, possibly 3rd graders who are able to write on their own.

**Begn. Guitar, 4-6<sup>th</sup> gr. – Susi Rowley** - Students will learn guitar basics, different strums, and worship songs, as they begin their journey to worshipping God through guitar! *\*acoustic guitar & electric guitar tuner required.*

**Early Americans (TOG) – Rochelle Giordano & Cindy Houghton** – Join us as we continue our journey through Europe learning about the changes in society that lead to the founding of America. *This is a full year course, there is an \$11.25 TOG co-op fee per semester, for those who do not own TOG year 2.*

**I.E.W. Writing (Instruction for early writing) - 5/6<sup>th</sup> grade – Jennifer Dimsey** – Introduction to writing techniques used in the Institute for Excellence in Writing program. This class prepares your student for our Jr. High Lit & Comp class!

**Composers and Art, 4-6<sup>th</sup> gr. – Cindy Houghton** – Come listen to 29 pieces and movements as you record information about each piece and illustrate a picture to go with it! This is a class with history, music, and art all in one!

### Jr. High – 7<sup>th</sup> – 8/9<sup>th</sup> grades

**Colonies, Crowns & Revolutions– Rochelle Giordano** - This year long course is a continuation of TOG History and will continue covering Renaissance and Reformation to the Age of Revolutions. Please join us as we journey through Europe learning about the changes in society that lead to the founding of America. *There is a \$14.00 co-op fee required for those who do not own TOG year 2. \*Class starts at 8:30am*

**Basic Baking – Victoria Bachelier & Lindsey Petersen** – Students will learn basic kitchen skills as they learn to bake tasty treats!

**Intro to Literature – Victoria Bachelier** – Students will study literary devices such as themes, settings, and imagery with comprehensive understanding. There will be some writing, however we recommend your student be enrolled in one of our writing classes along with this class.

**Life Science – Serena Sanders** – Examine God's handiwork by studying cells, genetics, classification and more, with in-class instruction and labs. This class will involve dissection labs as well as participation in the PSUSD Science Fair. **\*\*This class will extend into lunch 2 times per month.**

**Basic Sewing – Cindy Houghton** – Join us as we learn the simple operation of a sewing machine and then as we make simple creations that are useful for your home. Does anyone know what a quillow is? If not, join us as we learn how to make this unique item!

**American History, Jr. High – Betsy Aeschliman** – Students will journey through American History from the 1490's to the present with special emphasis on the personalities and events that shaped the American character. Through the story of America's rise to greatness, students will learn to recognize the hand of God in history.

## **Multi-Age Electives, 7<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades**

**Oil Painting – Mary Beth Stafford** – Come and join Mrs. Stafford, a well-known artist, and explore the multi-faceted techniques of oil painting.

**Writing Basics and Beyond – Kacy Tribble** – Not a lot of writing practice? Don't enjoy writing? Join this class and you will discover the joy of writing! This basic writing class will offer the principals of strong writing, grammar, and some literature. **\*class starts at 8:30am**

**IEW Writing/Comp B – Sally Hall – 8/9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> gr.** – This class is designed for students who have had a foundation in IEW and will develop and strengthen writing skills and vocabulary. Through the reading of assigned books, students will connect the importance of 'good literature' and develop literary analysis skills. **\*\*Pre-req. 2 years of Jr or Sr high IEW writing\*\***

**Math fundamentals – Kim Montgomery** – Prepare for Pre-Algebra and Algebra as your students review math fundamentals and math facts mastery as well as life skills requiring math.

**Begn. Guitar – Susi Rowley** – students will learn guitar basics, different strum patterns, and worship songs. Join us and start your journey to worshipping God through guitar! *\*acoustic guitar & electric guitar tuner required.*

**Intro to ASL & ASL Culture – Mylene Patterson** – This introductory class will teach students the basic skills of ASL and ASL culture giving students a glimpse into this amazing culture!

**A.S.B. – Renee Hinkston, 8-12<sup>th</sup> gr.** – ASB or Associated Student Body involves all of our students! This time will be set aside for Student Council meetings, making posters for upcoming events, learning Roberts Rules of Order, and planning for future events. There is no cost for this 'class' however 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students must enroll in order to be in the class during this time period.

**Theatre – Trish Evans** - Students will learn the fundamentals of acting & putting on a production. First semester concentrates on acting and theatre fundamentals. Second semester will include stagecraft, singing, dancing, producing, and performing in a full musical play.

**\*\*Class occasionally ends at 3:30 during first semester, prior to performance; second semester class will end at 3:30 weekly, and requires additional practice and set construction days outside of ICAP.**

## **Sr. High, 9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades**

**Biology – Karen Petersen** – This 10<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup> gr. lab course provides a detailed introduction to the methods and concepts of general biology. Emphasizing scientific method, classification, biochemistry, and cellular biology. This class will involve dissections as well as participation in the PSUSD Science Fair. **\* class starts at 8:30am**

**Pre-Calculus – Angela Mooney** - A great upper level math class for those students who have completed Algebra 2 & geometry. **\*class starts at 8:30am**

**British/American Lit. w/writing – Sally Hall** - This class is designed to introduce students to various components of British and American Literature, and to give them experience writing a variety of compositions based on IEW and Jensen's Format Writing. **\*class starts at 8:30am**

**Physical Science – Angela Mooney – 8<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> grades** – this lab class discusses such topics as the atmosphere, the hydrosphere, weather, the structure of the earth, the physics of motion, and astrophysics. (This class should be taken prior to high school biology).

**American History – Betsy Aeschliman** – This course will trace the history of America from its beginnings in Europe to the modern day. This class will use text books, original sources, artwork and modern media to enhance the student's understanding of the material.

**Speech, 10/12<sup>th</sup> gr. – Gary Evans** –This is the class that will help you overcome the number one fear of most people today- public speaking!

**Algebra 1 – Tami Lewis** – this course covers all topics in a first-year algebra course, from proofs, statistics and probability to algebra-based real-world problems. Students will begin developing the more complex, and understanding required for advanced mathematics. **\*\*Pre-requisite: Saxon math placement test**

**Algebra 2 – Tami Lewis** – this course covers all topics that are traditionally covered in a second-year algebra as well as a considerable amount of geometry. In fact, students completing Algebra 2 will have studied the equivalent of one semester of informal geometry. Real-world problems are included along with applications to other subjects such as physics and chemistry **\*This class ends at 3:30pm**
