

# ICAP STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

*Please read the following carefully and sign your agreement on the medical release form.*

1. Students are to respect fellow students, parents, and teachers. Titles of courtesy (Mr., Miss, Mrs.) will be used in addressing teachers.
2. Students are to maintain appropriate grooming and clothing standards. Neat and proper dress has a definite bearing in producing an environment conducive to learning and also displays an attitude of respect to those around you. Torn or frayed shirts or pants, short shorts or skirts, exposed undergarments, body piercing (other than pierced earrings for girls), tattoos, bare feet or stomachs, pants worn below the hip bone & extreme hair & make up styles will not be permitted. Hats or caps are not appropriate for boys in the classrooms.
3. Students are expected to complete appropriate course work at home, come to class on time, bring necessary supplies, and be prepared to participate.
4. CDs and tape players, pagers, telephones, skateboards, scooters and video games do not belong on the facilities. If found they will be confiscated until after classes are finished.
5. Students are to display proper classroom conduct. Courtesies such as remaining seated until dismissed and not talking out of turn are expected to be observed. Students are also to refrain from unkind remarks, profanity, coarse jokes, and other language unbecoming of a Christian student.
6. Our goal is to leave the facilities in the same or better condition than when we arrived, therefore, please be responsible for your trash and/or cans. Respect the landscape. Do not climb trees, walk through planters, climb on or over walls, or in other ways exhibit disrespect for the facilities that have been loaned to us.
7. Students are to be under the supervision of a responsible adult at all times including during lunch break. It is the student's responsibility to be in an area that is appropriately monitored. All students must be in their enrolled classes or in the study hall during each class session. Students must not be wandering about the facilities or helping in classes not previously assigned to.
8. Students are encouraged to make wholesome friendships between boys and girls. However, students should look upon one another as brothers and sisters in Christ and refrain from demonstrating personal affection at all ICAP functions.
9. Have an attitude of compassion for the differences, needs or disabilities of others. Cruel & unkind remarks & behavior will be addressed immediately & dealt with. Repeated behavior of this type will be grounds for dismissal from the program. We want this program to be a safe place for all students to enjoy learning and socializing together.

*All of these rules can be summarized simply by following the "Golden Rule" (Luke 6:31). As servants of god and one another, let us put aside our own selfish desires (1 Cor. 10:24), exhibit self-control (1 Thess. 5:8), and seek to follow Christ (Hebrews 2:12)*

## DISCIPLINE POLICIES

The above mentioned responsibilities and conduct expectations will be enforced. Students who refuse to comply with school policies will be faced with disciplinary action up to and including expulsion. Parents will be contacted regarding repeated occurrences of inappropriate conduct such as tardiness, incomplete assignments, disrespectful behavior to teachers, parents, or fellow students, and other disruptive classroom conduct. If this does not bring immediate change, the student will be asked to leave the program. Dress code violations must be resolved before being admitted to class. Any damaged property must either be replaced or repaired at the expense of the destructive student.

*Please remember that this is an optional program. We want to devote our energies to instruction, inspiration and equipping of students for a godly life, not policing unruly students. We want to give honor to the Lord, who has directed us and graciously provided excellent teachers and facilities. Let us not abuse this privilege. The continuance of this program depends upon the conduct of its participants.*
